To the Congregation: Let us keep our students and teachers in prayer. James 1:5 reminds us, "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him." Pray for wisdom, strength, patience, and courage for all returning to school. Encourage them with kind words, offer support where you can, and let them know they are not alone.

What's Next After the Gospel Meeting?

Our Gospel Meeting has come to a close, but the work of the gospel is far from finished. The lessons have been preached, the scriptures opened, hearts stirred, and visitors welcomed. Now the question for each of us is: What comes next? The days after a Gospel Meeting are just as important as the meeting itself. What we do now can help the seed of God's Word take root and grow—not just in our hearts, but in the lives of those we invited and those who visited.

Reflect on What You Heard ~ James tells us to be doers of the Word, not hearers only (James 1:22). Think back to the lessons presented. Were you convicted? Encouraged? Challenged? What truth stood out most? Take time to pray and apply what you've learned.

Follow Up with Visitors ~ If someone you invited attended, don't let the conversation end there. Reach out. Ask what they thought. Invite them back. Offer a Bible study. The Gospel Meeting may have planted the seed—but God often uses relationships to water it. "So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth."—1 Corinthians 3:7

Keep the Momentum Going ~ A Gospel Meeting is a spiritual boost—but we're not meant to coast afterward. Keep your zeal alive by continuing to read, study, pray, and serve. Set a new goal for spiritual growth, involvement, or outreach. "Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord." — Romans 12:11

Reconnect with the Church Family ~ The Gospel Meeting often brings members together in ways that regular routines do not. Let's continue that closeness. Reach out to someone you haven't talked to in a while. Strengthen fellowship. Look for new ways to serve one another in love. "Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor." — Romans 12:10

Encourage One Another ~ We all need encouragement to stay strong in the Lord. Reach out to a brother or sister who was uplifted during the meeting. Check in. Pray together. Grow together. "Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing." — 1 Thess. 5:11

Keep Sharing the Gospel ~ The Gospel Meeting is over, but evangelism never ends. There are still souls who need the truth. Keep inviting. Keep teaching. Keep shining your light. "Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season..." — 2 Timothy 4:2

Let's not let the Gospel Meeting be the end of something—let it be the beginning. Let it be a spark that leads to deeper faith, stronger fellowship, and greater commitment to Christ. The work continues.
